 2014-2015 ENROLLMENT - In your child's folder today you will find enrollment information for next year. <u>Please return your enrollment form promptly</u> to secure your child's place prior to open <u>enrollment for new families beginning on February</u> <u>1st</u>. As mentioned previously Concordia will continue to participate in the Racine Parental School Choice program and will begin accepting applications in February. A minimum \$100 deposit must accompany the enrollment form (\$70.00 for Preschool) for all nonvoucher students. Your early enrollment saves you \$45.00 per child and allows us to retain a seat for your child. Please contact the office or Mrs. Klein directly with any questions. We look forward to serving you and our growing community.

IMPORTANT VOUCHER **PROGRAM INFORMATION** Applications to apply for a voucher for the 2014-15 school year will be accepted in the school office on February 7th and 14th between 2:00 and 4:00 p.m. (or by special appointment with Lauran Sumner Coon). Students currently in the program and desiring to continue must complete a simple application and provide proof of residency during one of these sessions, as well. New families must provide income AND residency documentation when applying. For such families, a copy of their 2013 tax return is required - so get those taxes done promptly! Please keep in mind that families currently enrolled at Concordia (non-voucher students) are not eligible to apply unless the child is entering kindergarten or first grade. If you have ANY questions, please do not hesitate to call the school office.

INCLEMENT WEATHER – Now that the winter weather is truly upon us you are reminded that if the Racine Unified Schools close because of inclement weather, or go to a 2 hour delayed start, Concordia will be closed for the day. The Before/After School Programs will NOT operate on days school is closed. If the RUSD dismisses early, we will also close early. For up-to-date information on closings, tune to Channel 4, Fox 6, or Channel 12 or their corresponding radio broadcast. Typically notification is released by 6:00 am. If we are in school and conditions warrant early dismissal, you will be notified by phone.
